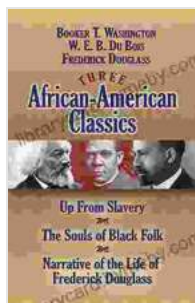

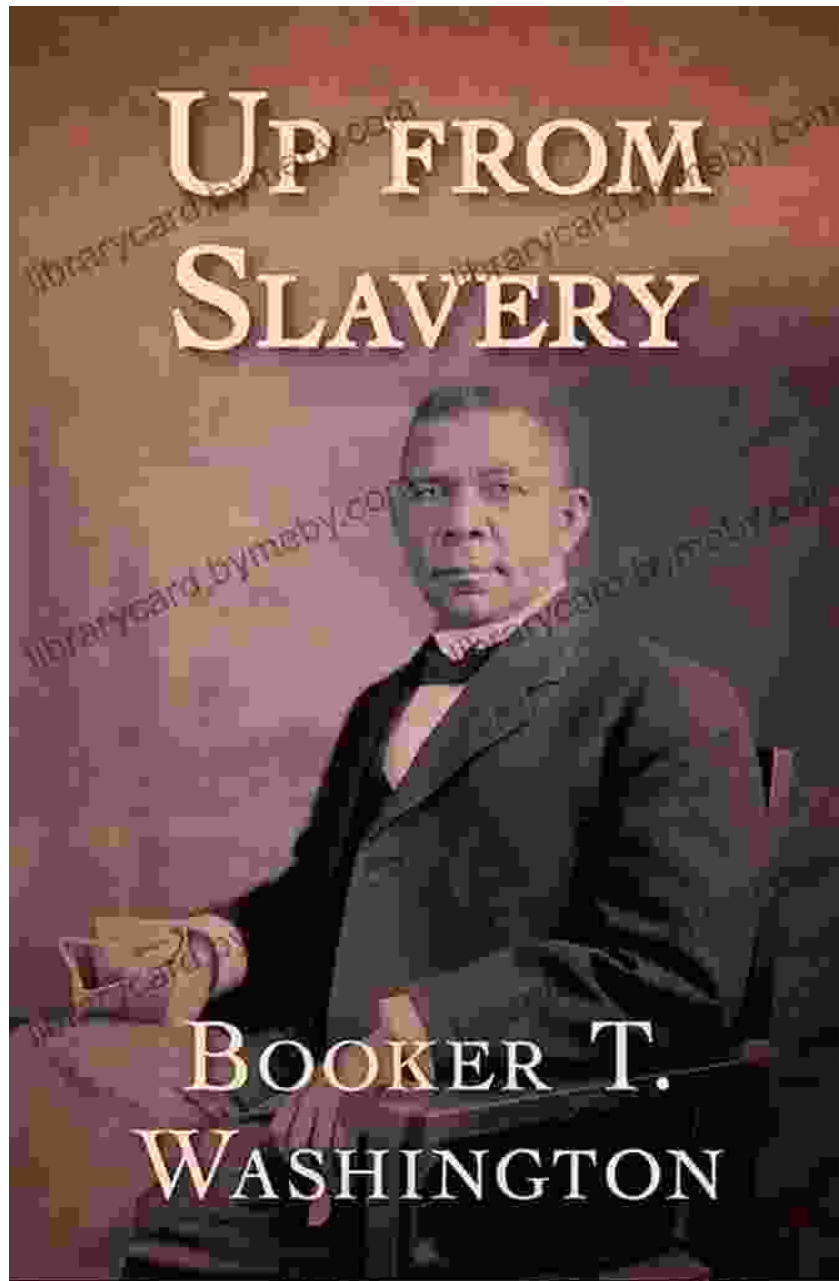

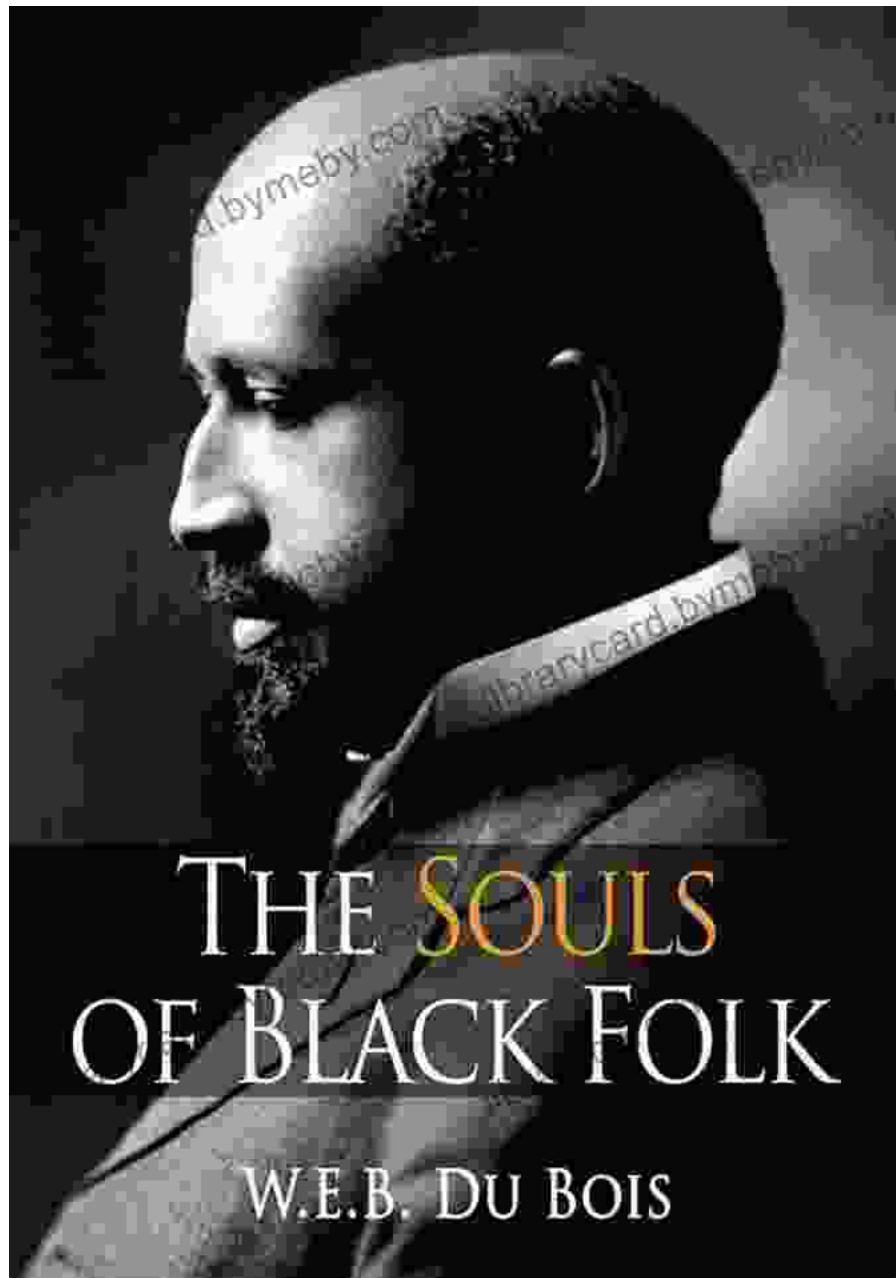
Book 1: "Up From Slavery" by Booker T. Washington

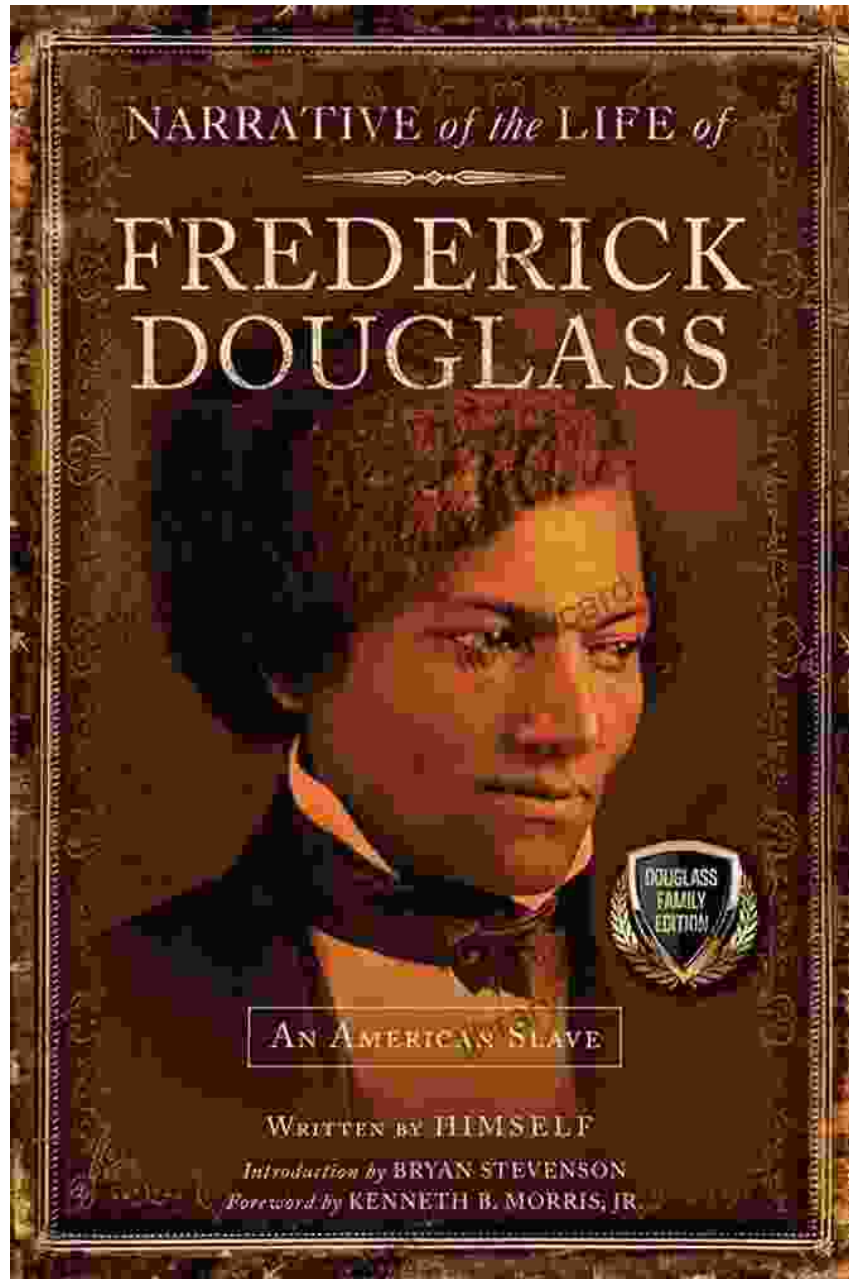

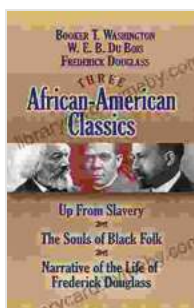

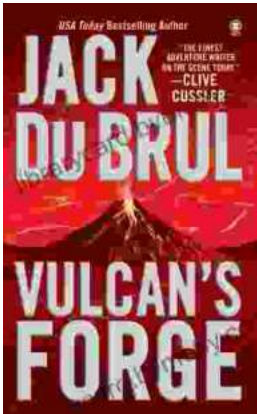
